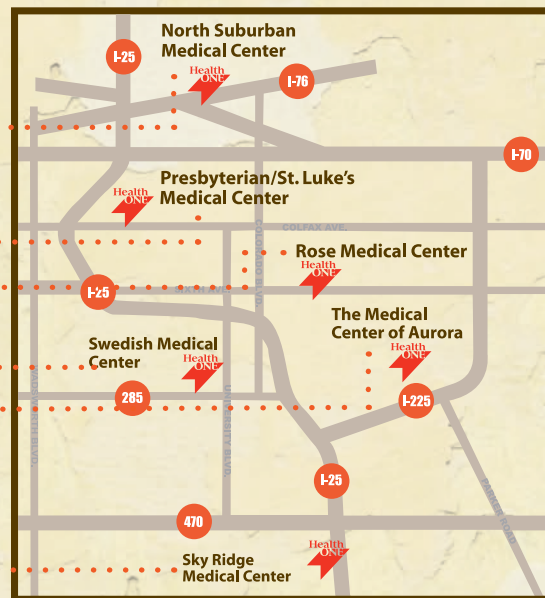
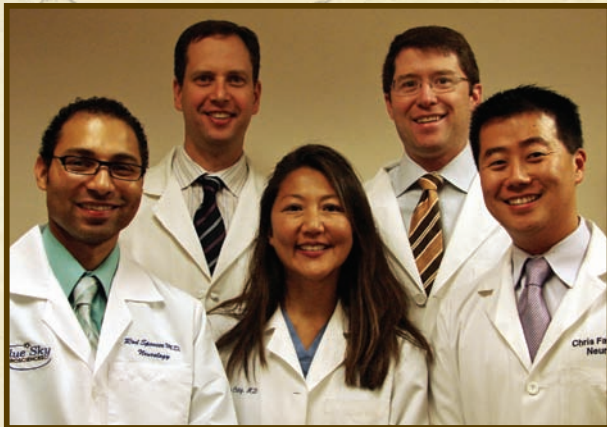

Faster Stroke Neurologist evaluation with telemedicine only at HealthONE Hospitals

Remote Presence Robotics, the latest in stroke technology, brings *a new, higher standard of comprehensive care for stroke patients in Colorado*. Each HealthONE hospital has a **Stroke Neurologist** present at the bedside with the attending emergency physician when a stroke alert is requested.



HOW IT WORKS

The InTouch Health Remote Presence[®] telemedicine technology includes a camera and microphone for live two-way audio and video communication.

- A Stroke Neurologist remotely connects and controls the robot.
- The Stroke Neurologist sees and hears your prehospital report at the patient's bedside.
- The neurologist is able to evaluate:
 - Patient's ability to move and speak.
 - Pupil size and reactivity.
 - Monitors and vital signs.
- Stroke Telemedicine is available 24/7/365 at all HealthONE hospitals and select rural and urban sites.

The HealthONE STROKE CARE

Region's Largest Comprehensive Stroke Network:

- Swedish Medical Center, which treats nearly three times more stroke patients than any other hospital in the state and is the only Stroke Center in the Rocky Mountain region four-times certified by The Joint Commission as an advanced Primary Stroke Center.
- An advanced Primary Stroke Center at The Medical Center of Aurora.
- A vast network of telemedicine cameras in 18 sites across urban and rural Colorado.
- Spalding Rehabilitation Hospital stroke program.
- The nation's first stroke-certified air transport team at AirLife Denver.



The GOLDEN HOUR of Stroke Care

Primary Stroke Centers at Aurora and Swedish consistently exceed national “Golden Hour” standards for the first critical hour of treating stroke for best outcomes:

- 100% of eligible patients receive clot-breaking tPA in less than 60 minutes from arrival – with a **goal of 45 minutes** across HealthONE Stroke Care network.
- Appropriate patients receive initial diagnostic CT **faster than the 25-minute goal**.
- North Suburban Medical Center was the first north metro telemedicine site, accessing Swedish neurologists since May 2006; they've cared for about 700 stroke patients and now have an average door-to-tPA time of 35 minutes.
